OBSERVE WATERING DAYS AND HOURS

Established water days for Escalon are as follows:

- ◆ **Even addresses** may water Sunday, Wednesday or Friday.
- ◆ **Odd addresses** may water Tuesday, Thursday or Saturday.

◆ Non-watering hours are 8:00am - 8:00pm and NO watering on Mondays.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REMINDERS

- Trailers & Vehicles in the street:** Just like with trailers, they cannot be parked in the street for more than 72 hours. If the vehicle has expired registration over 6 months, it can be towed off the street immediately. The owner will be responsible for all costs.
- Portable basketball hoops:** Cannot be kept in the street or on the sidewalk. Move the hoops up into the driveway, or if you do play with them in the street; remind yourself to put them away when finished playing.
- Vehicles on private property:** Need to be maintained in a clean fashion. Keep the undercarriage of vehicle free of cobwebs, leaves and other debris.

NO PARKING ON YOUR LAWN.

- Garage sale signs:** Remove all garage sale signs promptly after sale.
- Yard waste pick-up in street:** Public Works does not provide yard waste removal from the streets. Use the Gray or Green can for yard waste.
- Sheds & Accessory Buildings:** Contact the City of Escalon Development Services before you build or erect a structure on your property to ensure setback regulations, and zoning rules are followed.
- Grass and brush:** Keep yards and lots clear of brush and keep grass mowed to at least 6 inches or shorter. ■

MCHENRY AVE CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

Project features include:

- * Widen 1.1 miles of McHenry Ave. from 1,487 feet south of River Rd. to 190 feet south of Jones Rd.
- * Replace McHenry Ave Bridges over the Stanislaus River and SSJID Canal with wider and safer bridges
- * Add a signal at the intersection of McHenry Ave and River Rd.

* Install a center two-way left turn lane to facilitate turns into and out of driveways on McHenry Ave.

Project benefits include:

- * Enhance safety
- * Meet current seismic design standards for the new bridges
- * Accommodate existing and future traffic volumes
- * Improve access and circulation

STORM WATER CORNER

When caring for your lawn or garden, sweep fertilizer, soil and other debris from sidewalks and driveways instead of hosing them off. The flowing water will wash the pollutants into streams, rivers, and lakes. Avoid applying lawn and garden chemicals prior to rain events to reduce the concentrations of pollutants in stormwater runoff. Use non-toxic pest controls such as insecticidal soaps or lady bugs for aphids. Wash your car on the grass rather than in the street so the soapy water does not flow directly into the storm drain. To report illegal dumping into storm drains, please call the Escalon Stormwater Hotline at 209-691-7495. ■
